

# Fayston Emergency Management Protocol

May 15, 2021

- The Town Clerk's office, Lister's office and Zoning office are open to the public by appointment only for research. Walk-ins will be allowed to the front counter one at a time. Distancing and Masks required.
- There will be no more than 4 employees in the office at any time. Masks and sanitizing procedures will be strictly adhered to.
- Notary and marriage license services are available by appointment, conducted outside if at all possible, and if not, at the front counter.
- The Robert Vasseur Town Hall Meeting Room will not be rented for private parties, outside meetings, or classes until further notice.
- Residents should send dog renewals via mail or put through front door drop slot. No late fees will be assessed on dog renewals for 2021.
- For attorneys and title searchers:
  - Appointments are available for attorneys, real estate agents, surveyors, appraisers and any others needing to do title research.
  - Researchers will be asked to use the public work computer/space only to conduct their research.
  - Access to the vault is allowed with hand sanitizer and mask. No more than one person may be in the vault at a time.
- The Road Department will continue to operate. The Town Garage is off limits to the public except for deliveries. The Road Crew will limit their overlapping time in the garage itself with Road Foreman delegating outside work to the crew as needed. - Employee vacation policy: Employees should follow all CDC and State of Vermont protocols for travel. Currently:

**Unvaccinated Vermonters** (including children) who have traveled outside the state must be tested within 3 days of returning to Vermont.

The test you get must be for a **current infection** (like a PCR test), except it cannot be an antigen test (also known as a rapid test).

You do not need to quarantine while you wait for a result. But if you have any symptoms, stay home and away from other people.

Quarantining does not exempt you from the testing requirement. You may choose to quarantine, but are still required to get a test when you return to Vermont.

**Vaccinated Vermonters** (14 days past their final dose) do not need to get tested.  
**People who have recovered from COVID-19 within the last 3 months** do not need to test unless they develop new symptoms.

“Face Coverings Now Required” document approved by the Fayston Selectboard on July 14, 2020 remains in effect.

“Employee COVID-19 Screening and Process” approved by the Fayston Selectboard on October 20, 2020 is no longer in effect. Although the Selectboard encourages employees to take a sick day if they are not feeling well and should seek doctor’s advice should there be any Covid like symptoms.

All protocols may be changed as the situation evolves.
