- A. Field visit report: Woody, Lisa and Mike Jordan met to discuss care of pond and the need to remove saplings from the embankment.
- B. Next steps:
 - A small group of select volunteers will need to remove larger trees which require chainsaws and then a group of volunteers with hand saws can remove the smaller parts on the remainder.
 - Action Item: Determine liability of volunteers doing chainsaw work
 - Ky will contact Max Popowicz regarding chainsaw work. Certificate of Insurance naming town?
 - Volunteer liability form: run by Patti
 - Brush work on bank is not urgent, but can be done over time.
 - Debris: scientific information regarding if mulch is effective for managing phragmites: chips? Action Item: Get advice on best management practices to contain and reduce.
 - Brush piles are good wildlife habitat.
 - Vernal pool: vegetation should not be removed from that area. Needs to be kept shaded and should have vegetation buffer.
 - Action Item: Grace: determine natural resources best practices to advise on the best course of action in clearing brush.
