

FNRC Minutes from a Meeting Held June 14th, 2010

Minutes: Patti Greene-Swift moved, and Cory Stephenson seconded to approve the FNRC Minutes of May 10, 2010. Minutes unanimously approved.

Town Forest Maps & Reverence of Place Project: Cory brought in the maps the children produced from their GPS forest trail mapping day with Cory.
